

Strawberry Rows



Finished size: 40" x 46"

Pieced and appliqued quilt

*Bunny pattern not included


This is a quilt-as-you go pattern and works great with a jelly roll.

Directions are given using fabrics from quilt shown above. Replace pattern designs and colors with your choice of fabrics. Use $\frac{1}{4}$ " seams unless otherwise noted. *Illustrations are not to scale

What you will need:

Fabrics of your choice Heat N Bond EZ Print Lite sheets, $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" Heat N Bond Lite Iron-on Adhesive Spray N Bond Basting Adhesive Batting, 42" x 48"

Fabric requirements:

Cutting instructions:

Cut 1 - $6\frac{1}{2}$ " × $40\frac{1}{2}$ " (top of quilt)

Cut 4 - $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ "

Cut 2 - $7" \times WOF$, cut off selvedges (ruffle)

Cut 1 - $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF, cut off selvedges (vine)

Cut 3 - $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ "

Cut 1 - $4\frac{1}{2}$ " × 40 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (behind ruffle)

Cut 3 - $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ "

Cut 3 - $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ "

Cut 5 - $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ "



Cut 5 - $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF, cut of selvedges (binding)


Sewing and Applique Instructions:


Step 1: Strawberries and leaves—using an inkjet printer, print out applique pieces on Heat N Bond EZ Print Lite sheets or trace designs to the smooth side of Heat N Bond Lite ironon adhesive. Following the manufacturer's directions, iron adhesive side to <u>wrong sides</u> of desired fabrics. Let cool. Cut out applique pieces.

Step 2: Strawberry vine—iron $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 44" Heat N Bond

Adhesive to <u>wrong side</u> of $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF vine strip fabric following manufacturer's instructions. Let cool. Remove backing and apply vine strip to $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric strip as shown below, ironing small sections at a time. The fabric will curve as you iron it in place.








Step 3: Strawberries and leaves—remove backing from the strawberries and leaves. Apply applique pieces following manufacturer's instructions to <u>right side</u> of $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 40 $\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric strip placing over vine as shown. *It is recommended that all applique pieces be positioned in place before ironing. Blanket stitch, straight stitch, or zigzag around pieces after appliqueing to fabric.






Step 4: Quilt backing—this is an easy way to prepare quilt back: Protect the area where you will be working by placing an old sheet or paper under and around the area you'll be spraying. Place the quilt backing <u>wrong side up</u> on your working surface. Using the Spray N Bond Adhesive, spray about 6-8 inches across the top portion on the <u>wrong side of fabric</u> from one edge to the other. Place batting on top of the <u>wrong side</u> of quilt back over the sprayed surface. Smooth fleece/batting to ensure it adheres to the sprayed fabric. Continue this method of spraying and smoothing just 6-8 inches at a time until you reach the bottom of the quilt back. Check for creases or folds.

Step 5: With a washable pen, mark $40\frac{1}{2}$ " across and $46\frac{1}{2}$ " down on batting as shown in illustration. Trim along lines to remove excess batting and fabric.





Step 6: Using Spray N Bond Adhesive, spray <u>wrong side</u> of first/top $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strip. Place strip <u>right</u> <u>side up</u> across top of batting on quilt batting. Smooth into place making sure it is straight and goes from one side to the other.





Step 7: Place $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $40\frac{1}{2}$ " wide appliqued strip <u>right side down</u> on <u>right side</u> of first strip. Make sure it will be going the right direction once it is flipped open. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam across strips. Open and press seam flat.







Step 8: Sew 7" \times WOF (remove selvedge), right sides together at one short end. Press seam open. Fold in half lengthwise and press to crease.



Step 9: Gather the raw edge using a long basting stitch or a machine ruffler. Ruffle should be $40\frac{1}{2}$ " long when gathered.




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
Step 10: Place raw edge of ruffle along top edge of $4\frac{1}{2}$ " strip, <u>right sides up</u>. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top, securing ruffle to $4\frac{1}{2}$ " strip.






Step 11: Sew gathered piece, right sides together, to the appliqued row along ruffled edge. Flip down and press. Sew close to seam above ruffle.







Step 12: Continue sewing strips across quilt batting by placing right sides of strips together, sewing with a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam, flipping open, and pressing.





Note: Be sure to measure after adding a few rows to make sure you are keeping the strips straight. It's easier to make a slight adjustment as you go along rather than finding you are way off when you reach the bottom. Also, changing sewing directions by sewing left to right and then right to left helps keep rows straight, too.



Step 13: After all strips have been added, trim away any excess fabric and batting from top, bottom, and sides of quilt. Sometimes there is a little extra at the bottom of the quilt depending on seam sizes.

Step 14: Add addition decorative quilting, if desired.

Step 15: Optional -A pocket can be added to the back of the quilt to tuck in a stuffed animal, note, or gift card. Cut a $7\frac{1}{2}$ " square and fold to create a triangle. Place on lower corner and sew raw edges to quilt. *Bunny pattern not included.






Step 16: Finish with binding using your favorite method.







Large Strawberry - Make 1
