Armscye – The armhole, the fabric edge to which the sleeve is sewn.

Baste – Quick temporary stitching made by sewing with a long stitch length. Used to hold two pieces of fabric together temporarily.

Backstitch – Sewing with overlapping stitches at the beginning and end of your stitchline in order to secure the stitches in place.

Casing – A folded over edge of fabric (or a separate piece of fabric applied) used to enclose a drawstring or elastic.

Clipping – Cutting into a seam allowance, resulting in a flatter seam when turned right side out.

Easing – Evenly distribute fabric around the curve so that there is no puckering.

Finish a Seam – A method used to prevent the fabric edges from fraying. Can be done using a serger/overlocker or with a zig zag stitch along the edges.

Gather – Sew two parallel rows of basting stitches along the edge of the fabric to be gathered (do not backstitch). Gather fabric by pulling the fabric along the bobbin (bottom) threads.

Grading Seams – Trimming your seam allowance to various levels, therefore reducing bulk in the seams.

Grainline – The grain runs parallel to the selvedge of the fabric.

Hem – A garment finishing method where the bottom edge of fabric is folded to the wrong side twice, pressed, and sewn.

Press – Use of an iron to press fabric in a specific direction.

Staystitch – A straight stitch sewn through one layer of fabric, most often used to prevent distortion around a curve.

Topstitch – A line of stitching typically sewn between 1/8" to 1/4" away from the edge of a seam. Stitch length should be set to a slightly longer length, 3.0-3.5 is a common length.

Understitch – A line of stitches that are sewn close to the edge of a facing to keep it from rolling towards the outside.

Scissors or Rotary Cutter


Needle for Hand Sewing

Yarn or Ribbon for Hanging











Always check that you are printing at 100% or "actual size". Print only the first page of the pattern to check the 1" (or 5cm) square with a hard ruler before printing the rest.

The orientation should be set to Auto. Please make sure that "choose paper source by PDF page size" is NOT selected.

Your purchase includes 2 files:

- The Tutorial + Print at Home Pattern Pieces meant for using with a home printer
- A projector file meant for use with a projector (see blog post for more details)








This pattern contains trimless pages. Match the corners with the corresponding letters in the circle and tape or glue in place. Cut the pattern pieces out.









Trace the ornaments and the placement markings onto your felt using a Frixion pen (or any heat erasable marking tool).



Step 2

Using embroidery floss, embroider faces onto the gingerbread person, snow person, and reindeer. You may use a satin stitch or french knot. Alternatively, you may use embellishments like buttons, sequins, heat transfer vinyl, permanent fabric markers, etc. to embellish the faces.

Step 3

Using embroidery floss, embroider the snowflake onto the mitten. You may use any stitch you'd like, we used a backstitch.



Step 4

Using the permanent fabric adhesive, adhere the embellishments onto the snow person. The scarf will be adhered in two steps. First, adhere the rounded scarf piece to the snow persons neck. Then, adhere the rectangular piece on top.

Optional: Alternatively, you may hand stitch the embelishments down. You may also use embellishments like buttons, sequins, or heat transfer vinyl instead of felt.





Adhere the nose onto the reindeer using the permanent fabric adhesive. Adhere the antlers to the inside of the back piece.



Step 6

Using the permanent fabric adhesive, adhere the ornaments onto one of the tree pieces. On the second tree piece, center the trunk along the bottom edge and adhere with the permanent fabric adhesive.





Hand sew the pieces together using either a blanket stitch (left) or a running stitch (right). Alternatively, you may machine sew around the edges or use the permanent fabric adhesive to adhere the pieces together. You will need to allow drying time if choosing the latter.

Important: Leave an opening at the top of the ornament for stuffing.



Step 8

Add stuffing to your ornaments through the opening left at the top.



Snow person, Reindeer, and Gingerbread person: Place a small piece of ribbon into the opening and sew the opening closed.

Tree: Place a small piece of ribbon into the opening and sew the opening closed. Using the FabricFuse, adhere the stars to the top of the tree. One will go on the front, the other will go on the back. It is helpful to use a sewing clip to hold the two pieces together while the FabricFuse dries.

Mitten: Place a small piece of ribbon into the opening and sew the opening closed. Sandwich the top edge of the mitten between the mitten cuff pieces and fuse together with FabricFuse. It is helpful to use sewing clips to hold the pieces together while the FabricFuse dries.













- cut lines

- Also ensure the "Choose paper source by PDF page size" is not selected
- The orientation of the pattern is LANDSCAPE. Ensure the orientation is set to either landscape or auto.


