

Fly Over

A Patchwork & Applique Quilt



Size: Finished 50" x 60"

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Applique Supplies:

Airplane Templates (in this pattern)

HeatnBond® Lite EZ Print Iron-On Adhesive – 5 sheets
or HeatnBond Lite if you want to trace the templates

Fabric Needed:

(there is a color sheet included in this pattern for color changes)

5/8 yard blue

1 yard brown

2 ½ yards white

½ yard blue for binding

3 ½ yards (42" wide) of cotton backing fabric or 2 yards (60" wide) of cuddle Minky fabric

Other supplies:

Rotary cutter and mat, Thread, Iron, Inkjet printer, Sharp scissors, Sewing machine,
StitchnSew High Loft Sew-In Fleece 60" wide or Batting, and other basic sewing supplies

Fabric Cutting:

Blue:

Cut 60 – 3" squares

Cut 15 – applique airplanes (airplane block instructions)

Brown:

Cut 15 – 5 ½" squares

Cut 60 – 3" squares

White:

Cut 15 – 10 ½" squares

Cut 60 – 3" x 5 ½" rectangles

Binding:


Cut 6 – 2 ½" x width of fabric strips

Fly Over Quilt Instructions


Please read through all instructions before starting.

All seams are stitched at $\frac{1}{4}$ " unless otherwise stated.

Classic Block



For one block: Four white 3" x 5 ½" rectangles, one 5" brown square, and four brown 3" squares




Stitch them right sides together as laid out with $\frac{1}{4}$ " seams.

Stitch the corner squares to the small side rectangles
then stitch the top and bottom middle rectangles to the middle square.
Next stitch the three columns together.

Make a total of 15 of these blocks

Applique Airplane Block



For one block: One 10 ½” white square, four blue 3” squares, 1 set of airplane applique templates

If you are using HeatnBond EZ Print Lite sheets, print the applique pattern pieces (the last sheet of this pattern) with your inkjet printer. There are 3 airplane templates on the page, so print the templates on 5 sheets for 15 airplanes.


Follow the package instructions for printing and bonding to the wrong side of the fabrics.

NO TRACING! How awesome is that?

With other fusibles, the pattern pieces will need to be traced on the paper side of the adhesive. Follow the manufacturer’s instructions for tracing the patterns and bonding to the wrong side of the blue fabric. The patterns have been reversed for you.

Finger press the 10 ½” white background square in half twice to find the center of the fabric. Unfold and lay the square on an iron safe surface, right side up.

Cut out all applique pieces on the solid black lines, peel off the backing paper, and place applique with the adhesive side down as shown below on the 10 ½” square piece of background fabric. Place the wings first (B), then the body (A), and finally the prop (C).



Bond the Applique Pieces to the Background

Following the package instructions, work in sections to press the entire applique to the background until the entire applique is fused.


Stitch around applique

Use a straight, zigzag, or blanket stitch to stitch around each applique piece with thread.

Finish the Applique Airplane Block


Add the blue triangles to the block by drawing a diagonal line across the wrong side of each 3" blue square. The drawn line is the stitching line for each.

Place the blue squares, right side down in each corner of the 10 ½" white square.



Stitch on the drawn line of each blue square.

Trim off the outside corners (both white and blue fabrics) ¼" from the stitched line to make the ¼" seam allowance.




Press the blue triangles to form a 10 ½" quilt block.

Make a total of 15 of these blocks.

Finish the Fly Over Quilt Top

With right sides together, sew the Classic Blocks to the Applique Airplane blocks as shown below.

Note: the blue triangles are a smidge smaller than the brown blocks and are not meant to match, but give a beautiful secondary pattern.




Press the seams well.

Finish the Fly Over Quilt

Finish the quilt using your favorite quilting and binding method.


