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Supplies:

Heat n Bond Lite, Iron-on Adhesive Heat n Bond EZ Print Lite Sheets Spray n Bond Basting Spray (optional) Aurifil Thread Oliso Iron Batting

Fabric needed:

White - 15/8 yard
Dark Green - 7/8 yard pieced borders or 11/2 yards borders cut lengthwise
Yellow - 3/8 yard
Red - 11/2 yards pieced borders or 13/4 yards borders cut lengthwise
Light Green - 1/4 yard
Black - 1/8 yard
Quilt backing - 33/4 yards (add extra if needed for quilting)

Cutting instructions:

Cut $13 - 8\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 8\frac{1}{2}$ " white squares (applique background)

Cut $6 - 9\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 9\frac{1}{2}$ " red squares (hourglass block)

Cut $6 - 9\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 9\frac{1}{2}$ " white squares (hourglass block)

Cut $10 - 2\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 8\frac{1}{2}$ " yellow strips (sashings)

Cut $10 - 2\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 8\frac{1}{2}$ " light green strips (sashings)

Cut $2 - 1\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 48\frac{1}{2}$ " dark green strips (left and right Border A)

Cut $2 - 1\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 42\frac{1}{2}$ " dark green strips (top and bottom Border A)

Cut $2 - 4\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 50\frac{1}{2}$ " red strips (left and right Border B)

Cut $2 - 4\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 50\frac{1}{2}$ " red strips (top and bottom Border B)


Cut $6 - 2\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 43$ " strips (Binding)

Sewing/Applique Instructions: Seams are sewn 1/4" wide


Step 1: Applique - Prepare the applique patterns using iron-on adhesive; follow package directions. Iron adhesive pieces to <u>wrong side</u> of fabrics following package directions. Cut out applique pieces. Peel off paper liner from the backs of applique pieces. Place applique, adhesive side down, on <u>right side</u> of fabric. Press according to package directions until entire piece is bonded. Let cool. Sew around edges of applique using a straight, zig-zag, or blanket stitch.

Step 2: Assemble hourglass blocks


You'll need one white square and one red square to make two blocks. Draw a line diagonally on wrong side of light square. Place right sides of squares together. Sew a 1/4" seam along both sides of the drawn line.



Cut the block along the drawn line to create two blocks. Open and press fabrics to the dark side.



On one of the blocks, draw a diagonal line opposite from the seam on the wrong side of fabric. With right sides together and nesting the seam, sew 1/4" along both sides of the drawn line. Cut the blocks along the drawn line. Open and press seams toward the side. Trim blocks to $8\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $8\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat to make a total of 12 blocks.




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
Step 3: Assemble sashing rows - With right sides together, sew two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $8\frac{1}{2}$ " yellow strips and three $2\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $8\frac{1}{2}$ " light green strips together as shown below. Make two sets. Press seams towards green strips.

With right sides together, sew two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " light green strips and three $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " yellow strips together as shown below. Make two sets. Press seams towards green strips.

Step 4: Assemble applique blocks and hourglass blocks - With right sides together, sew rows together in order shown below. Press seams towards applique blocks.




Step 5: Assemble applique/hourglass rows with sashing rows – With right sides together, sew sashing rows between applique/hourglass rows as shown below; match seams. Press seams down.



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Step 6: Border A – With right sides together, sew $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $48\frac{1}{2}$ " dark green strips to left and right of Step 5's rows. Press seams towards borders. With right sides together, sew $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $42\frac{1}{2}$ " dark green strips to top and bottom of Step 5's rows. Press seams down.



Step 7: Border B - With right sides together, sew $4\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $50\frac{1}{2}$ " red strips to left and right of Border A. Press seams towards borders. With right sides together, sew $4\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $50\frac{1}{2}$ " red strips to top and bottom of Border A. Press seams down.



Step 8: Finish quilt using your favorite method of quilting and binding.

*Quilt assembly with batting and basting spray:

Protect the area where you will be working by placing an old sheet or paper under and around the area you'll be spraying. Place the batting on work area, smoothing to remove wrinkles. Place the quilt backing, wrong side down, on top of batting. Smooth to remove wrinkles. Having the batting a bit larger than the backing is suggested.

Roll back about six inches of the quilt back to expose some of the batting. Using the basting spray, spray batting from one edge to the other. Carefully lay the <u>wrong side</u> of quilt backing over the sprayed surface of batting. Smooth fabric to ensure it adheres to the sprayed fabric and remove any wrinkles. Roll back the rest of the quilt back to continue spraying and smoothing about six inches at a time until you reach the bottom of the quilt back. Check for creases or folds you might have missed.

Turn backing and batting over to have batting facing up. Lay quilt front, wrong side down, on batting. Make sure quilt front is lined up correctly; smooth out wrinkles. Use the same spray and smooth method as the backing. Trim edges and square-up quilt. Quilt as desired and add binding.
